


THE ORDER OF THE HOLY COMMUNION

A NOTE TO OUR VISITORS: We rejoice in having you share with us our Lord's gift of His grace to us through His Word. The Lord's Supper is celebrated in the service today. God's Word directs us that only those who are sufficiently instructed to examine themselves that they might recognize the body of Christ in the Sacrament (1 Cor. 11:28-29) should partake thereof. The members of Trinity Lutheran Church believe and confess the real presence of the incarnate Lord Jesus in His body and blood in and under the bread and wine of His Supper, discerning that the bread is a communion of the true body of Christ, and the wine is a communion of the true blood of Christ (1 Cor. 10:16). Such "communion" testifies to the unity of faith among all those who partake (1 Cor. 10:17). This presupposes unity in both doctrine and confession (Acts 2:42). If you are a communicant member in good standing of a congregation of The Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod or The American Association of Lutheran Churches, fellowship with us is a given, "sufficient instruction" is assumed. Therefore, you are invited to join us at the Lord's Table. If you are a fellow-believer of another denomination not in confessional fellowship with us, yet desiring to commune, we kindly request that, prior to communing, you speak with the pastor concerning your participation in the Lord's Supper.

Holy Gospel

Luke 10:1–20

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the tenth chapter.



¹After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to go. ²And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. ³Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. ⁴Carry no moneybag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road. ⁵Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' ⁶And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you. ¬And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages. Do not go from house to house. ®Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you. ¬Heal the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' ¹OBut whenever you enter a town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say, ¹¹¹Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet we wipe off against you. Nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of God has come near.' ¹²I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.

13"Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. 14But it will be more bearable in the judgment for Tyre and Sidon than for you. 15And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? You shall be brought down to Hades.

¹⁶The one who hears you hears me, and the one who rejects you rejects me, and the one who rejects me rejects him who sent me."

¹⁷The seventy-two returned with joy, saying, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us in your name!" ¹⁸And he said to them, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. ¹⁹Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall hurt you. ²⁰Nevertheless, do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."





